

**WRFURA Match Report Policy**

The WRFU Men's Division I and Men's Division I Collegiate competitive structures require the referee to report the score within 48 hours. Referees who do not report the score will be subject to the following penalties.

- Any referee who does not report the score for the first time in an assigned match in the competitive cycle will be put on probationary status for their second match.
- If the Referee fails to report the score a second time in an assigned competitive cycle match, the individual will be removed from all WRFU Competitive Cycle matches for the remainder of the competitive cycle. The referee will be put on probation and placed at the bottom of the list for assignment for ALL upcoming WRFU Championships at the end of the current competitive cycle.
- In the following competitive cycle, any referee who is on probation will be given an initial opportunity to referee in the WRFU Competitive Cycle matches. However, failure to report the score for their first officiated match will result in removal from all WRFU competitive region matches for the remainder of the cycle. The referee will not be allowed to participate in any Territorial Championship matches at the end of the Championship cycle and remain on probation. The same probation structure will be in place for the following years(s).

The competitive region area schedulers are responsible for all non-WRFU referees who are scheduled for any matches within their sub-region. It is their responsibility as the scheduler to inform the visiting referee of his/her responsibility to report the match to the WRFU Administration Office. The failure of the visiting referee to report of match score becomes the area schedulers fine.

Fine Repayment:

The WRFU is taking the fines out of the money given to the WRFURA for the Championship structure. The WRFURA will not be held responsible for the fines imposed. All fines for failure to report scores are to be reimbursed to the WRFURA. Any referee who does not pay the fines levied against them will be removed from all WRFU appointment consideration and be on probation until all fines are collected. All referees have ten business (10) days that includes the Monday after the match to pay all fines in full. All fines must be received by the WRFURA Treasurer by the close of business on Friday, ten (10) business days later.
